Concerning the preparations and provisions provision of vessels of warr.

Concerning Captaine Holaves, wee have ~~it~~ with great sincerity assured the Ambascador that he had used  no Commission to take Capo Verde nor any other place belonging to the Dutch or to ^{doe} ~~doe~~ any Act of hostility upon any of the subjects of the

U. P. ~~that~~ ^{our} was ^{sent} cut for the defence of our subjects &
that trade into those parts: And we cannot but expect
that this our free conduct shall find more ~~credit~~
Credit with our Allies than any informations or examinations
of Mariners & Seamen who seldom know what they
inform: We expect the said Captain Holmes his
arrivall here every day, & will then upon due
inquiry into all that he hath done, determine what
is just. His Ships at present designed for those
parts are ships to Trade & have neither power nor
will to wrong the Subjects of the U. P. But
We are very heartily sorry to hear with how
generall Ruinours, & of loose businesses of Privateers,
but here de persequant surdige & full information of our
Governour of our Port of Comantine: That
about the end of January last the Commanders
of the Ships belonging to the Dutch West-Indian
Company, after many assaults upon our Merchant ships
in those Seas, and forbidding & restraining them from
trade, did stire up & hire the King of Fantine
to assault & surprize the Sea Coast of Comantine,
& to put the same into their hands, for the
price of Sixty Bendys, whereunto one halfe was
paid downe by the said Dutch Commanders,

We cannot in any degree doubt that the States of
the Rep. will manifest their detestation of this

of War to justify these unwarrantable & scandalous
proceedings, ^{which would be attended with ill effects,}
& would inevitably produce a War between the
two Nations (which we desire to prevent) their
Wisdoms will require & warn their W. I. C.
that they hereafter forbear these outrages, & that
they do not presume under the Style of Merchants
to usurp the prerogative of Princes, & assume
such a Dominion to themselves as if it were in
truth vested in them, would not warrant them
