FINAL REPORT

I/ INTRODUCTION

1. The Council of Ministers held its seventeenth session from 1 to 3 July 1985 in the Banquet Hall of the Headquarters of the Togolese People's Rally (Maison du RPT) in Lome, Republic of Togo.

II. OPENING SESSION

3. The session was opened by Mr. Komla ALIPUI, Honourable Minister of Economic Affairs and Finance of the Republic of Togo. On behalf of His Excellency, General Gnassingbe EYADEMA, Founder Chairman of the Togolese People's Rally, President of the Republic, and on behalf of the Government and people of Togo, the Honourable Minister welcomed the distinguished delegates and observers participating at this session which coincided with the 10th anniversary of ECOWAS. In his opening speech, the Minister stressed the need to strengthen the collective self-reliance of ECOWAS while ensuring that the resources of the Community are managed efficiently. (The text of the Honourable Minister's speech is attached as an appendix to this Report).

4. In reply to the welcome speech, Major Sory DOUMBOUYA, Honourable Minister of Finance and Economic Affairs of the Republic of Guinea and Chairman of Council took the floor

and on behalf of the National Military Recovery Council and the Guinean Government expressed sincere gratitude to General Gnassingbe EYADEMA and to the Government and people of Togo, for their constant willingness to contribute to all matters affecting African unity and particularly the success of ECOWAS.

5. The Honourable Minister pointed out to Council that the main objective of this session should be to look back over the activities so far carried out and reflect with courage and determination on the future of our Community even if for any reason we cannot take stock of the last 10 years of ECOWAS in detail (The speech is attached as an appendix to this Report).

CONCLUSIONS OF DELIBERATIONS

ITEM 2: CONFIRMATION OF THE APPOINTMENTS OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY AND THE MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE FUND

8. The Council, in accordance with the powers vested in it, confirmed the appointment of Mr. Mahenta Birima FALL as the Managing Director of the ECOWAS Fund for Cooperation, Compensation and Development. Council also decided to submit for the consideration of the Authority the confirmation of the appointment of Mr. Momodu MUNU as the Executive Secretary of ECOWAS. To this end, a draft Decision for adoption by the Authority is attached as an appendix to this Report.

ITEM 3: OATH OF ALLEGIANCE OF THE MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE FUND

Mr. Mahenta B. FALL swore an oath of allegiance as Managing Director of the Fund before the Council in accordance with the provisions of Article 7 of the Staff Regulations.

ITEM 4: EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

10. The Executive Secretary presented his report in which he outlined the progress made by ECOWAS and stressed the difficulties encountered in the implementation of development programmes and projects adopted by the decision-making bodies of the Community. The report also identified the resources necessary for the nursuance of the objectives of the Community and made projections for the future.

11. The Executive Secretary's report focussed on the following four headings :

- economic situation
- activities of the Community
- relations with the outside world
- 1985/86 work programme

12. After congratulating the Executive Secretary for the quality of his report, Council made the following observations:

- On the economic situation of states of the sub-region, Council noted that the report did not mention IMF (International Monetary Fund) interventions in certain Member States, particularly, financial adjustment programmes designed to correct imbalances.

Henceforth, the Executive Secretariat should inform Council of measures taken in this regard in collaboration with the IMF and assess their impact on the economic situation of Member States.

The Secretariat should also outline the various measures to be adopted to overcome the economic crisis in the sub-region.

- Council noted that the report did not sufficiently underscore the deterioration of terms of trade. Export earnings in real terms have remained unchanged despite the increase in the value of the dollar - the major trading currency. Commodity prices keep falling because of international speculation, while the prices of manufactured goods continue to rise.

- Council also observed that the report made no reference to the debt situation, one of the causes of the present stagnation of the economies of Member States. The Executive Secretariat should focus greater attention on the problem of excessive indebtedness of Third World countries particularly ECOWAS Member States. This issue should be examined more thoroughly to find ways and means of alleviating the harmful effects of the crisis on the economic situation of States of the sub-region.

- On economic recovery, Council requested the Executive Secretariat to modify its approach in the implementation of the relevant programme. In addition to the services of universities, the Executive Secretariat was further directed to resort to experienced practitioners in the field of economic development, bearing in mind the recommendations of the Lagos Plan of Action and Final Act.

- Council requested that the portions of the report relating to the way in which experts of the Ministerial Ad Hoc Evaluation Committee had carried out their work, and to the problem of non-implementation of Acts and Decisions of the Community be presented in a more circumspect manner.

- Council directed that in future the Executive Secretary's report on the co-existence of IGO's in the sub-region be presented in a more acceptable form.

Council took note of the report of the Executive Secretary.

ITEM 5: REPORT OF TECHNICAL COMMISSIONS

a) Agriculture, Industry and Natural Resources Commission

13. After presentation of this report by the Secretariat, Council took note of comments made by the Commission concerning

the revision of the studies on ~~Community cattle breeding~~ centres and seed production centres which were to be carried out in 2 phases :

Phase 1 : Study and reinforcement of centres already in operation

Phase 2 : Study of centres yet to be established.

14. On the recommendation relating to emergency aid measures to alleviate the effects of drought and famine in Member States, Council requested that in view of the importance of this item, it should be considered under item 6 of the agenda, that is, Economic matters.

b) Trade, Customs, Immigration, Money and Payments Commission

15. The report and recommendations were presented by the Chairman of the Commission and they were adopted by Council with the following observations :

1) Trade : The Consultation and Coordination Committee responsible for programming Trade Fairs and similar events should, as soon as it is established, compile a list of the various types of Trade Fairs and Commercial events in the sub-region in order to determine those which should be organised at Community level and those which are to be organised at the national level.

The Committee should also outline the type of coordination to be established between the two groups.

2) Customs :

a) Computer Programme

- having taken cognisance of the need to computerise external trade data of Member States, and in view of the fact that the ASYCUDA project could be improved upon, Council

recommended that the Executive Secretariat should take the necessary steps to ensure :

- i) that this project becomes more functional and compatible with the systems existing in the other Member States; and
- ii) that a more efficient computer system is installed in the Member States.

- As regards the Lome Computer Centre the Secretariat was directed to set up a Committee of Experts to assess the requirements in this area and the cost of establishing the centre. The Secretariat was also requested to draw up the technical specifications in order to enable Council take a decision.

- Concerning the list of industrial enterprises which may have the capacity to export their products to Member States and as a result benefit from the preferential tax applicable to originating Community products, Member States were requested to forward this list to the Executive Secretariat together with the dossiers of the industrial enterprises concerned. These documents would be submitted to a Committee of Experts for examination.

3) Immigration : In the light of the report which was presented by the Commission relating to the application of the provisions of the Protocol on the Free Movement of Persons, Right of Residence and Establishment, Council members were in favour of moving on to the second phase as provided for in the Protocol. However, Nigeria and Liberia expressed reservations on this item, concerning the immediate application of the second phase of the Protocol.

Article 2. The mobilization of funds should be undertaken at the
same time as the launching of the tenders.

DECIDES:

Article 1. The four winning models in order of merit are as follows:

Article 2. The cost for each project-design shall not exceed a maximum of five (5) billion CFA francs, an amount fixed, and not subject to revision, for the construction of the Headquarters of the Executive Secretariat at Abuja (Federal Republic of Nigeria).


Article 3. The winner of the competition shall operate within the limits set in Article 2 above while taking into consideration the desired technical and town planning criteria.

Article 4. In the event that the winner of the competition does not fulfill the conditions laid down above, the second bidder shall be retained.

THE COUNCIL

MINDFUL of Article 6 of the ECOWAS Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions;

CONSIDERING the decision of the Heads of State and Government relating to the allocation of the Headquarters of the Executive Secretariat and the Fund to the Federal Republic of Nigeria and the Republic of Togo respectively;

IN CONFORMITY with Decision A/DEC.17/5/82 of 29 May 1982 of the Heads of State and Government that the construction of the Headquarters of the Secretariat and the Fund in the Federal Republic of Nigeria and the Republic of Togo respectively should be financed by the Community;

FOLLOWING Decision N° C/DEC/6/11/82 of 17 November 1982 of the Council of Ministers stipulating that the same procedure should be followed for the construction of the Headquarters of both Community Institutions;

CONSIDERING the recommendation of the Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee at its meeting held in July 1984 in Lagos that the financing for the construction of the Fund Headquarters should be made up of 40% of Fund's resources and 60% loans from friendly financial sources;

DECIDES

Article 1. The Executive Secretariat shall comply strictly with Article 1 paragraph 3 of Decision C/DEC.6/11/82, stipulating

that preliminary studies relating to the construction of ~~Secretariat Headquarters~~ shall be financed by a loan given by the Fund which will be refundable;

Article 2. The financing for the construction of the Headquarters of the Executive Secretariat shall be made up of 40% of Fund's resources and 60% to be borrowed on the best possible terms.

Article 3. The method of financing shall be in line with the following objectives:


- i) implementation of the architectural contract;
- ii) effective participation of firms established in the sub-region;
- iii) maximum utilisation of local materials.

Article 4. The total amount to be spent on the construction of Headquarters shall not exceed five (5) billion CFA francs. This amount is not subject to revision.

Article 5. This Decision shall enter into force upon signature and shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community and in the National Gazette of each Member State.

DECIDES

Article 1. The various companies in the tender for the Project Management Consultant are hereby awarded the following points:

- Associated Consultants, Ghana	: 77.97
- Milton & Richards, Liberia	: 77.47
- Towry-Coker Associates, Nigeria	: 64.65
- Krakue Mercer & Partners, Ghana	: 61.65
- Cabinet AUDA Engineering of LOCOH-DONOU, Togo	: 58.14
- BCEOM, Togo	: 51.90
- Deji Oyenuga & Partners, Nigeria	: 27.01

Article 2. In the event that the difference was very little difference between the total points of the first and second firms the Fund shall negotiate with the two firms and choose the lesser bidder.

Article 3. During the negotiations the objectives shall be to ensure that the cost of the Project Management Consultant does not exceed 1% of the total cost of the construction project.

Article 4. The Fund shall contact the first two firms, asking them for proposals which shall include direct cost and additional cost to ensure that the Fund does not meet any other obligations.


Article 5. The winner shall submit all documents in the two official languages (English and French).

Article 6. The Sub-Committee of Experts composed of Benin, Nigeria and Togo shall help the Fund during contract negotiations and the preparation of contracts.

Article 7. This Decision shall enter into force upon signature and shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community and in the National Gazette of each Member State.

Article 3 : The cost of all assignments for SCDTEC shall be negotiated at 0.75% of the total cost of works excluding the cost of road works and other networks.



His Excellency, Chairman of the Council of Ministers
Honourable Ministers
Mr. Executive Secretary
Mr. Managing Director of the Fund
Distinguished Delegates
Distinguished Guests
Ladies and Gentlemen,

Yesterday, the people of Togo, united behind their Government and the Founding Chairman of the Togolese People's Rally and President of the Republic of Togo, His Excellency General Gnassingbe EYADEMA, had great pleasure and indeed felt honoured in hosting the meetings of the Technical Commissions, the Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee on the Construction of the Headquarters of our Institutions and the Board of Directors. Added to that are the devastating effects of imported inflation and excessive indebtedness.

To make matters worse, implacable nature, through drought, has been devastating daily the majority of Member States of our Community.

Faced with all these challenges, we must take bold and judicious decisions to rekindle the hopes of our people raised ten years ago at the inception of ECOWAS.

This anniversary must be an occasion for us to evaluate our past activities and exchange ideas on future activities, as well as changes to be made where necessary.

Futhermore, our major concern must be the sound management of all the resources which our people are toiling to make available to the Institutions of our Community, for it would be intolerable to let reprehensible negligence and waste prevail in ECOWAS Institutions whereas at national level strict accountability in resource management is the order of the day.

Your Excellency, honourable Ministers, Ladies and Gentlemen, it is my ardent hope that these crucial observations will be the guiding principles in ~~our deliberations which, I daresay will take place in the Community sphere which has always~~ prevailed.

c) Transport, Communications and Energy Commission

16. Council took note of the Report of the Commission, which dealt mainly with cooperation in petroleum and petroleum products. It was however pointed out that, as a general rule, when experts of the Community are commissioned to carry out studies, they should also consider technical aspects and the resources necessary for the implementation of the proposed recommendations. Council therefore requested that the document be improved through :

- i) a country by country evaluation survey of all projects identified;
- ii) identification of the ways and means necessary for the implementation of such projects.

ITEM 6: ECONOMIC ISSUES

17. Since no documents were submitted on this item, the various delegations exchanged views on the continued deterioration of the economic situation in the sub-region, characterised by :

- i) Drought and desert encroachment which are afflicting virtually all Member States, particularly the Sahelian States which are suffering from considerable grain deficits.
- ii) External debt problems of Member States, which are hampering economic development, since debt servicing takes up a large part of export revenue.
- iii) Low level of agricultural development.
- iv) The participation of the IMF in the preparation of financial programmes of certain Member States.

18. In this connection, Council recalled the text of the Lome Resolution A/RES.1/11/84 on economic recovery in which the Heads of State and Government decided to adopt a common position on the economic crisis currently afflicting the sub-region. The Resolution also recommends ways and means of overcoming the crisis through concerted Community policies and programmes which will cover all areas of economic activity.

19. It was pointed out that, in order to make this Resolution effective, the Authority decided to set up an Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee to examine all the problems relating to the crisis.

20. Council observed that this Committee had not yet been set up and designated the following Member States as members :

- Chairman : TOGO
- Members : BURKINA
GHANA
NIGERIA
SENEGAL

21. Council also decided that henceforth economic issues should always be included on the agenda of each of its sessions as a matter of course. The Executive Secretariat was directed to take the necessary steps to ensure that this is done.

22. Council appealed to all Member States to adopt a common position on all issues to be discussed during the next Economic Summit of Heads of State and Government of the OAU which is scheduled to take place from 18 to 20 July 1985 in ADDIS-ABABA.

ITEM 7: CONSIDERATION OF WAYS AND MEANS OF ENSURING THE
IMPLEMENTATION OF DECISIONS BY MEMBER STATES

23. Council took note of the Memorandum presented by the Executive Secretariat on the extent to which Member States had honoured their commitments to the Community.

The following observations were made :

- The Executive Secretariat was directed to update the document indicating the status of ratification of Protocols and Conventions attached to the Memorandum, in view of the new information supplied by some Member States.
- Council rejected the proposal to set up an Ad Hoc Committee to assist the Secretariat in the prompt implementation of Community Acts and Decisions. An appeal was however made to Member States to establish national structures for the coordination and monitoring of ECOWAS affairs in States where such structures do not exist and to endow these units with adequate resources to enable them carry out the tasks assigned to them effectively.
- Council urged all Member States to implement Community Acts and Decisions.
- To avoid delay in payment of contributions, the Executive Secretariat was directed to contact Member States with a view to establishing a time-table for payments which would enable the countries to pay up their arrears by instalments.

ITEM 8: REPORT OF THE AD HOC MINISTERIAL COMMITTEE ON THE
CONSTRUCTION OF INSTITUTIONAL HEADQUARTERS (FUND
AND SECRETARIAT)

24. On the construction of the headquarters of the Secretariat, Council approved the gradings based on merit for the four designs selected by the Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee as follows :

25. Council examined project costs at length and decided to fix a maximum of 5 Billion F CFA and not subject to revision for the construction of the headquarters of the Executive Secretariat in ABUJA (Federal Republic of Nigeria) in view of the difficult economic situation prevailing in the Member States.

26. Council requested the Executive Secretariat to instruct the winner of the competition to operate within the limits of the amount approved without jeopardising the desired technical and town planning criteria.

Should the winner reject these proposals, the second bidder should be selected for the construction works.

27. Council also arrived at the following results after opening tenders for the construction.

1. Model N° 6 : AIM Consultants (Nig) Limited in Association with YUSUF MOHAMED Association (Nigeria).
2. Model N° 1 : A.T.A.I. - R.K. FARA (TOGO)
3. Model N° 15 : EGBOR and Associates (Nigeria)
4. Model N° 11 : Messrs NIGER Consultants (Nigeria)

28. The financing scheme for the construction of the headquarters of the Executive Secretariat would be the same as for the Fund i.e. 40% from the Fund's resources and 60% to be borrowed on the best possible terms.

29. As regards the construction of the headquarters of the Fund, Council adopted the report of the Ministerial ad hoc committee and amended the recommendation relating to the financing of the construction. Council directed that the management of the Fund should continue with on-going negotiations with a view to obtaining loans under the most advantageous conditions.

ITEM 9: REPORT OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE FUND

30. Council adopted the Report of the Board of Directors of the Fund and decided that the Recommendation on external financing of the Fund Headquarters should be amended in accordance with the recommendation of the Board which directs

the Fund Management to pursue on-going negotiations with external financial sources to ensure the best terms of financing.

ITEM 10: REPORT OF THE AD HOC MINISTERIAL COMMISSION
ON EVALUATION

31. This item was discussed in a closed session.

ITEM 11: PREPARATION OF THE AGENDA FOR THE SUMMIT OF THE
AUTHORITY OF HEADS OF STATE AND GOVERNMENT

32. The draft agenda submitted by the Executive Secretariat was adopted and is attached as an appendix.

ITEM 12: OTHER MATTERS

33. The Executive Secretariat informed Council that the terms of office of the Deputy Executive Secretary (Economic Affairs) and the Deputy Executive Secretary (Administration) would be expiring in July and in September 1985 respectively.

34. The Executive Secretary also informed Council of the appointment of Mr. Ahmed HAIBA of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania to the post of External Auditor.

ADOPTION OF REPORT

35. This report was adopted.

36. At the end of the meeting, Mr. Yaovi ADODO, the Togo Minister for Planning and Industry, standing as Chairman of Council for the Minister for Finance and Economic Affairs, Mr. Komla ALIPUI ~~expressed his gratitude~~

~~to the Honourable~~ Ministers and delegates for the high quality of work done. He congratulated the Managing Director of the Fund on his appointment and confirmation. He then re-affirmed the need to strengthen sub-regional cooperation to ensure a better future for our people, since ECOWAS provides the ideal framework for economic integration.

CONSIDERING that Mr. Mahenta Birima FALL has accomplished with satisfaction the six months probation period referred to above;


DECIDES:
