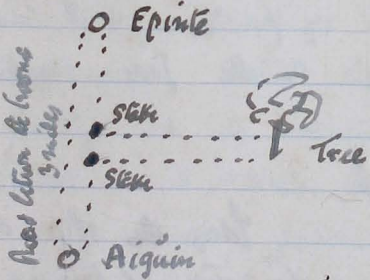

The name Dai of the Indohar of Peho or Empoho have since arrived with that of Indem besides I am convinced that the name is not wrongly expressed, or possibly set down in mistake as ready to <sup>amused</sup> ~~amused~~ declare in appon the Dai concluded the contract as Indohar of Peho or Empoho & was succeeded by his brother the present Indohar Boowa.

He has not yet heard of original contract in lands of people of Empoho, to see & he does here it he will report.
