The directors of the WTC. in compliance with your orders received on the ... , having further considered the opinions of yr Hon. Mightiness upon the report drawn up by the Co upon the points of the Regulation, proposed by the Envoy Extraordinary of His Majesty of Gr Britain for the prevention of all disturbances have observed that, in the verbal reply of Y. H. M., to the propositions ~~asked~~ by the Co in their first statement of which they was asked for, you were pleased only to order the Co to prepare such papers & reports that were necessary for the boundary-delineation of New Netherlands, without, apparently, having had regard to what was further requested by the Co before the Regulation was approved, namely: - restitution of all forts, places, jurisdictions, lands, ships & goods with the appurtenances thereof.

Therefore the directors, with all submission, again reconstrute to yr Hon. M. that unless their propositions are previously confirmed in their entirety & carried on, in their entirety, very great wrong would be done to the Co, moreover, the proposed Regulation will cause more confusion than any unity within the respective Charters as it would be very sad for the Co that the English should remain in the forts & places which had been conquered & built by the Co with bloodshed & the loss of money & goods; & that the Co being mortgaged as by the English, will be obliged, with hands tied by a Regulation, to abandon places which it has possessed, without contradiction, for 40, 30, & 20 years, & now to evacuate them, because it has pleased the English have been pleased, & with the forces at their disposal have been able, to carry out their intentions.

Moreover, & by the conclusion of this Regulation without making a specific agreement about the restitution of the captured forts, places, jurisdictions, lands, ships & goods, the English will never be brought to do so. May even if this were afterwards demanded, they will dare to take the contention of the Co as a contravention of the Regulation, & from this still greater disturbances will arise within the respective Charters, than those which have hitherto broken out.

They therefore respectfully request that J^r Hon. Mightines will be pleased to take the matter into consideration & again reflect whether it is not extremely justifiable that what has been captured should be previously restored & whether this Regulation, without effecting restitution of everything, will remove all disturbances. For now, again, advices come from Guinea that they are continuing their unlawful designs & having again corrupted the natives of the country with gifts & presents, have besieged & captured the fort at Cabo Corso as well as 2 ships, they ^{not} further intended to pursue their designs against Castle del Mina & Nassau. From all which it can sufficiently be perceived that this Regulation has only been proposed to detain the State over it & when everything shall have been lost, then to say that they being alone the masters, all regulations are unnecessary.

And, with that, coming to the opinions of J^r Hon. M^o, on the report of the Co on the first point namely, that all that can be reasonable, in this point outside Europe can & must also be alleged as reasonable inside Europe & consequently if the Co's opinions, as so far as regards the Charter are admitted that then the same practice would have to be introduced also in Europe, which would be extremely injurious to trade & therefore
consideration

consideration being given to what was best for trade in Europe, that Mr. Downing's proposal would have to be amplified [i.e. - generalise] & also be followed outside Europe because ~~there~~ of ~~ought~~ the similarity there ought to be in all places in the whole world.

If then, Englishmen will please again consider the reasons alleged in justification of the Co's advice on the first point about the difference in the places, & that the intention of the State to establish one basis throughout the whole world in order to prevent disturbances, can just as well be accomplished without any alteration in the advice of the Co being made, since if what is proposed by the Entry Extraordinary is established in Europe, & what is requested by the Co in the regions of the respective Charters is established, the State will just as well attain its object, & it could by no means be suspected of having had any other object than the good of both the Nations, even though one understanding is adopted in Europe & another within the limits of the Charter, about what is to be understood by a place being bordered & traded at when actually beleaguered: Because, in Europe this is expressly provided for between Potentates, in their treaties. And what practice & experience has taught, even to the English themselves, is that not everything that is treated as to trade within Europe must also be the procedure outside Europe; & arguments for places outside Europe cannot be applied to places within Europe, or Vice Versa. Consequently, places situate outside Europe, & subject to the authority of other nations, cannot be treated according to the general practice & usage; & therefore the argument about trade at places everywhere in Europe should not be applied to places outside Europe where it should be prohibited & prevented by nations within each other's

other's jurisdiction. If therefore Yr Hon^{rs} mightnesses are pleased to apply considerations of State so far as trade in Europe only is concerned & upon the considerations of the Co that they should not be presented in the free course of theirs. You will be able to solve the difficulties which you have been pleased to put forward.

The directors also request Yr Hon^{rs} M^o. to apply these further speculations to the 3rd point - on which the Co has, *inter alia* maintained that trade should not be allowed with a nation which was under the obligation of exclusive trade to the other Co, & even if this practice - if introduced into Europe - would be extremely prejudicial to trade in Europe & that & could not be allowed by the State in Europe & therefore could not be allowed outside Europe - as the Co requests - so as not to give occasion to use it as an example, to the injury of the State, yet, under correction those considerations are rendered void by what has been here before pointed out & the request of the Co should be allowed so as to avoid the obliquity of understanding one & the same matter differently at various places.

Now as regards Yr Hon^{rs} mightnesses' considerations upon the 1st point. The directors of the W.C. gladly admit that in their report they considered it was a point that could be put into practice throughout the whole world without prejudice to the 2 nations, & thereby have not followed their particular interests but what was agreed upon by the State in Art. 25 of the treaty of peace with the Crown of England; but with unwarlike correction & with all respect they will again remonstrate to Yr Hon^{rs} M^o that [? object to YH M^o's opinion that?]

Still, if Y^r Hon^{rs} Mo. are pleased to make a distinction in this point between Europe & other regions, the Co considers your opinion can be complied with & if that point is made a condition, it can be practised all the world over without prejudice to both nations; but if Y^r Hon^{rs} Mo. make a distinction here between the rules in Europe & outside it, that distinction ought much more to be made in the 1st & 2nd points, which deserve 10 times more consideration than this 10th point.

And in order that the object of this regulation may be fully attained, the W^{ch} Council, in addition to their views expressed, further request: 1^{stly} that the English should not be allowed to exclude the Co from the river Fambara, on the Coast of Africa where there are several considerable Nations who had carried on trade with the Co before the English dispossessed the Co of its forts on that river - the violation of which is requested in the Catalogue of the Damages.
